THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

Please remember that masks are required to cover the nose and mouth.

There is no singing during the service. Please meditate upon the meaning of the words as the songs are played.

All are to participate in the reading of the 12 steps which are inserted within the context of the Liturgy and the Great Thanksgiving.

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Celebrant: Without help it is too much for us. But there is One who has all power. That one is God. May you find God now! Half measures availed us nothing. We stood at the turning point. We asked God's protection and care with complete abandon. These are the steps we took, which are suggested as a program of recovery:

Step 1: We admitted we were powerless over our addiction; that our lives had become unmanageable.

Collect for Purity

Celebrant: Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our lord. **Amen.**

Celebrant Lord have mercy.

People Christ have mercy.

Celebrant Lord, have mercy.

Step 2: We came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity.

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

Collect of the Day

Almighty and everlasting God, in Christ you have revealed your glory among the nations: Preserve the works of your mercy, that your Church throughout the world may persevere with steadfast faith in the confession of your Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen**.

Collect For Those Affected by Addiction

O blessed Lord, you ministered to all who came to you: Look with compassion upon all who through addiction have lost their health and freedom. Restore to them the assurance of your unfailing mercy; remove from them the fears that beset them; strengthen them in the work of their recovery; and to those who care for them, give patient understanding and persevering love. **Amen.**

Step 3: We made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understand God.

The First Reading

Isaiah 53: 4 - 12

Reader: A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

Surely he has borne our infirmities and carried our diseases; yet we accounted him stricken, struck down by God, and afflicted.

But he was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the punishment that made us whole, and by his bruises we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have all turned to our own way, and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth.

By a perversion of justice he was taken away. Who could have imagined his future? For he was cut off from the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people.

They made his grave with the wicked and his tomb with the rich, although he had done no violence, and there was no deceit in his mouth.

Yet it was the will of the Lord to crush him with pain. When you make his life an offering for sin, he shall see his offspring, and shall prolong his days; through him the will of the Lord shall prosper. Out of his anguish he shall see light; he shall find satisfaction through his knowledge.

The righteous one, my servant, shall make many righteous, and he shall bear their iniquities. Therefore, I will allot him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong; because he poured out himself to death, and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

Reader The Word of the Lord. **People Thanks be to God.**

Psalm 91: 9 – 16 Please read responsively by full verse

- 9 Because you have made the Lord your refuge, and the Most High your habitation,
- 10 There shall no evil happen to you, *neither shall any plague come near your dwelling.
- 11 For he shall give his angels charge over you, to keep you in all your ways.
- 12 They shall bear you in their hands, lest you dash your foot against a stone.
- 13 You shall tread upon the lion and adder; you shall trample the young lion and the serpent under your feet.
- 14 Because he is bound to me in love, therefore will I deliver him; I will protect him, because he knows my Name.
- 15 He shall call upon me, and I will answer him; I am with him in trouble; I will rescue him and bring him to honor.

16 With long life will I satisfy him, and show him my salvation.

Second Reading Hebrews 5: 1 – 10

Reader: A reading from Paul's letter to the Hebrews.

Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness; and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the

people. And one does not presume to take this honor, but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was.

So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him, "You are my Son, today I have begotten you"; as he says also in another place, "You are a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek."

In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to Jesus and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." And he said to them, "What is it you want me to do for you?" And they said to him, "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory." But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?" They replied, "We are able." Then Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared."

When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. So Jesus called them and said to them, "You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of

all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many."

Litany For Healing

Celebrant: Let us name before God those for whom we offer our prayers.

The people may audibly name those for whom they are interceding.

Reader: God the Father, your will for all people is health and salvation;

People: We praise you and thank you, O Lord.

Reader: God the Son, you came that we might have life, and might have it abundantly;

People: We praise you and thank you, O Lord,

Reader: God the Holy Spirit, you make our bodies the temple of your presence;

People: We praise you and thank you, O Lord.

Reader: Holy Trinity, one God, in you we live and move and have our being;

People: We praise you and thank you, O Lord,

Reader: Lord, grant your healing grace to all who are sick, injured, or disabled, that they may be made whole;

People: Hear us, O Lord of Life.

Reader: Grant to all who seek your guidance, and to all who are lonely, anxious, or despondent, a knowledge of your will and an awareness of your presence;

People: Hear us, O Lord of Life.

Reader: Mend broken relationships, and restore those in emotional distress to soundness of mind and serenity of spirit;

People: Hear us, O Lord of life.

Reader: Bless physicians, nurses, and all others who minister to the suffering, granting them wisdom and skill, sympathy and patience;

People: Hear us, O Lord of life.

Reader: Grant to the dying peace and a holy death, and uphold by the grace and consolation of your Holy Spirit those who are bereaved;

People: Hear us, O Lord of life.

Reader: Restore to wholeness whatever is broken by human sin, in our lives, in our nation, and in the world;

People: Hear us, O Lord of life.

Reader: You are the Lord who does wonders;

People: You have declared your power among the peoples.

Reader: With you, O Lord, is the well of life;

People: And in your light we see light.

Reader: Hear us, O Lord of Life;

People: Heal us, and make us whole.

Reader: Grant that every member of the Church may truly and humbly serve you;

People: That your Name may be glorified by all people.

Reader: We pray for Michael, our Presiding Bishop; Jennifer, our Bishop; Barbara Anne+ our priest; and Fr. Brown.

In the Anglican Cycle of Prayer, we pray for The Church of the Province of the West Indies.

In the Diocesan Cycle of Prayer, we pray for those affected by domestic violence and addictions; and we pray also for

St. Stephen's, Terre Haute, the Rev. Andrew Downs and the Rev. Deby Veach.

Celebrant: O Christ for whom we search, our help when help has failed; give us courage to expose our need and ask to be made whole; that, being touched by you, we may be raised to new life in the power of your name. **Amen.**

- Step 5: Admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.
- Step 6: Were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character.

The Confession

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

A period of silence is observed.

Minister and People:

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone, We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

Step 7: We humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings.

Absolution

Celebrant: Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. Amen.

Step 8: Made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all.

Step 9: Made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others.

Celebrant The peace of the Lord be always with you.

Announcements

Step 10: Continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong promptly admitted it.

Celebrant: If you are offering your gift at the altar, and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother and then come and offer your gift. (Matthew 5: 23-24)

Step 11: Sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God as we understand Him, praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out,
